

New Haven Community Youth Fair Scholarship

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1. ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

All graduating seniors involved in the New Haven Community Youth Fair (i.e. volunteering, queen contest, 4-H involvement including but not limited to livestock, soda stand, archery, home economics)

2. AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP

The New Haven Community Youth Fair board will give one scholarship for \$500.00. This amount is subject to change and will be determined annually by the New Haven Community Youth Fair Board.

3. TIME SCHEDULES

- a. Completed applications must be postmarked by March 1st:

- b. Selection of the winner and runner-up will be made by the end of March.
- c. No later than August 1st, the winner and the runner-up must notify the New Haven Community Youth Fair of their enrollment.

4. CRITERIA IN SELECTING THE WINNER

- a. Applicant's interest in furthering his/her education in order to prepare for a vocation
- b. Participation and leadership in the community and involvement in the New Haven Community Youth Fair
- c. Applicant's reputation for good citizenship and good moral character
- d. Applicant's financial ability (sources of income, his/her willingness to work to help him/her out, etc)
- e. Applicant's satisfactory academic progress
- f. **Winner will be required to volunteer five hours to help during the fair. This year's fair dates are Friday and Saturday, July 5th & 6th, 2024.**

5. SELECTION OF WINNER

The committee will select one winner and one runner-up. The runner-up is eligible for the scholarship only if the winner does not enroll in college or drops out and the runner-up is enrolled. The recipient must commence his/her *post-secondary* education no later than September following his/her graduation from high school. The recipient must go to an accredited school and may select any course the study he/she desires to pursue, providing that it leads toward an academic degree or certificate. The name of the winner will be announced at the recipient's high school graduation or at the awards ceremony.

6. HANDLING OF MONEY

The New Haven Community Youth Fair will pay the scholarship directly to the college the recipient will attend. Should the student fail to finish a term, it is the student's responsibility to notify the proper college officials and to complete all necessary forms. Any scholarship money lost through the student's failure to finish a term becomes the student's responsibility.
